

Pupil Achievement & Progress in 2019

Class 10 cohort this year was 25 which included: 8 students (32%) with Special Educational Needs (SEN) and 5 students with Pupil Premium funding (PP Students).

Additional GCSE Data

- 56% pupils achieved 5+ GCSE standard passes or above with English and Maths, 76% in 2018
- 100% pupils achieving 5+ GCSE passes (100% in 2018)
- 68% pupils achieving 5+ GCSE standard passes (84% in 2018)
- 100% pupils achieving at least 1 GCSE pass (100% in 2018)
- 36.32 APS for GCSEs (38.8 in 2018)
- 44% pupils achieved higher grade passes (8 or 9) (25% in 2018)

Analysis

- Improvement in school's Attainment 8 pupil achievement data;
- Progress 8 Data, yet to be published, should continue to be in excess of +1;
- Sharp improvement in EBacc APS (average points score) for pupils;
- Sharp increase in the number of pupils achieving higher grade passes (8 or 9);
- Continued outstanding English results;
- Lower than anticipated results in maths has had a marked negative impact on several areas of overall school headline data.
- Girls achievement has declined whilst boys achievement has increased.
